




DID YOU KNOW? SOUND FACTS

- 1. Sound moves by particles vibrating through solids, liquids or gases. It travels at 335 metres per second in air.
- 2. Sound travels four times faster in water than in air.
- 3. There is no sound in Space as it contains few particles.
- 4. Sound is reflected to form an echo.
- 5. Sound travels slower than light.
- 6. During a thunder storm, you always see lightning before you hear the thunder.
- 7. Sound is measured in decibels. Sounds above 85dB can harm your ears.
- 8. Speaking is measured at 60dB, rock concerts can reach 130dB!
- 9. Scientists use sound waves (SONAR or Sound Navigation and Ranging) to measure the depth of the ocean. They send out sound waves and record how long it takes for the wave to return.
- 10. Ships and submarines use SONAR to navigate the ocean, chart the seabed and look for sunken vessels.
- 11. Dogs hear much higher sounds than humans.
- 12. Bats and dolphins hear much lower sounds than humans.
- 13. The three smallest bones in our body (the hammer, anvil and stirrup) are in the ear. They are the size of a pea and help us to hear sound.
- 14. Flies cannot hear at all!
- 15. The eruption of Krakatoa in 1883 was the loudest sound in human history. It was heard across almost 8% of the whole world!
- 16. Fighter jets travel faster than the speed of sound and this is called breaking the sound barrier.
- 17. Dairy cows listening to music during milking release more milk.
- 18. High pitched sounds (ultrasounds) are used in medicine to see a pregnant mother's baby and to destroy brain tumours.
- 19. Sound can be used as a warning, eg a hissing cat.
- 20. Dolphins and bats navigate using sound.
- 21. Sound can affect our mood and emotions.
- 22. Birds and whales talk to each other via sound.
- 23. 105dB sounds can break glass.

5 food colours.


Water and a spoon.

- 4. Which jars have the highest or lowest pitch?




